Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

Proverbs 9:8-11

**⁸Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you;
reprove a wise man, and he will love you.**

**⁹Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser;
teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning.**

**¹⁰The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom,
and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.**

**¹¹For by me your days will be multiplied,
and years will be added to your life.**

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 28; Psalms 73,74,75,76**

Sunday: Proverbs 30:7-9 Two things I ask of you; deny them not to me before I die:

⁸Remove far from me falsehood and lying; give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with the food that is needful for me, ⁹lest I be full and deny you and say, “Who is the LORD?” or lest I be poor and steal and profane the name of my God.

- Level 1 — Draw a man sitting at a table with enough food for today, but with neither a pile of treasure nor an empty plate.
- Level 2 — What two dangers are associated with riches and poverty? What does he want more than either one?
- Level 3 — Why can it be difficult to pray, “Lord, do not give me more than is good for me”?

Monday: Proverbs 10:15 A rich man’s wealth is his strong city; the poverty of the poor is their ruin.

Proverbs 19:4 Wealth brings many new friends, but a poor man is deserted by his friend.

Proverbs 22:7 The rich rules over the poor, and the borrower is the slave to the lender.

- Level 1 — Draw someone protected inside a strong city and another person chained to a lender by a debt.
- Level 2 — According to these proverbs, what benefits can money provide? What kinds of security, freedom, or opportunity can it bring?
- Level 3 — Where in your life have you seen the benefits of God blessing you with money? Where have you seen the difficulty of poverty, either in your own life or others?

Tuesday: Proverbs 28:11 A rich man is wise in his own eyes.

Proverbs 13:8 The ransom of a man’s life is his wealth, but a poor man hears no threat.

Proverbs 23:4-5 Do not toil to acquire wealth; be discerning enough to desist. ⁵When your eyes light on it, it is gone, for suddenly it sprouts wings, flying like an eagle toward heaven.

Proverbs 11:28 Whoever trusts in his riches will fall, but the righteous will flourish like a green leaf.

- Level 1 — Draw money growing wings and flying away while one person looks proud and another looks worried.
- Level 2 — What dangers of wealth do these verses identify?
- Level 3 — Which danger of money is most tempting for you: pride, worry, always wanting more, or trusting money instead of God? What could help you resist that temptation?

Wednesday: Proverbs 15:17 Better is a dinner of herbs where love is than a fattened ox and hatred with it.

Proverbs 17:1 Better a dry morsel with quiet, than a house full of feasting with strife.

- Level 1 — Draw two family meals: a simple meal where everyone loves one another and a great feast where everyone is angry and arguing.
- Level 2 — Why is the simple meal described as better? What makes a home truly rich according to these proverbs?
- Level 3 — What do you actually believe is the best thing you could offer your family or those around you?

Thursday: Proverbs 28:6 Better is a poor man who walks in his integrity than a rich man who is crooked in his ways.

Proverbs 22:1 A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches.

Proverbs 16:8 Better is a little with righteousness than great revenues with injustice.

- Level 1 — Draw two roads. On one road, a poor person walks straight. On the other, a rich person walks down a crooked path carrying money.
- Level 2 — What do these verses say is better than riches or great income? Why is a good name so valuable?
- Level 3 — Can you think of a time you’ve traded your name or integrity for money? A time you’ve passed by money to retain your integrity? Do you have regrets in either situation?

Friday: Proverbs 15:16 Better is a little with the fear of the LORD than great treasure and trouble with it.

Proverbs 16:16: How much better to get wisdom than gold!

Proverbs 8:10-11: Take my instruction instead of silver...for wisdom is better than jewels.

- Level 1 — Draw a person being offered two treasures: a chest filled with gold and a Bible representing wisdom and the fear of the Lord.
- Level 2 — What do these verses say is better than treasure, silver, gold, and jewels? Why?
- Level 3 — In what ways is Jesus better than wealth?

Saturday: Proverbs 10:4 A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich.

- Level 1 — Draw a line of ants carrying bags of money to their ant hill.
- Level 2&3 — What questions do you have about this passage?
