Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

Proverbs 9:8-11

**⁸Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you;
reprove a wise man, and he will love you.**

**⁹Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser;
teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning.**

**¹⁰The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom,
and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.**

**¹¹For by me your days will be multiplied,
and years will be added to your life.**

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 29; Psalms 77, 78, Luke 11, 18**

Sunday: Proverbs 10:4 A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich.

Proverbs 16:26 A worker's appetite works for him; his mouth urges him on.

- Level 1 — Draw a picture of someone working hard.
- Level 2 — According to Proverbs 10:4, what is the difference between a slack hand and a diligent hand? According to Proverbs 16:26, what is one basic reason people work?
- Level 3 — Where do you need to become more diligent—in school, chores, your job, or something else? What would diligence look like there?

Monday: Proverbs 6:6–8 Go to the ant, O sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise. ⁷Without having any chief, officer, or ruler, ⁸she prepares her bread in summer and gathers her food in harvest.

Proverbs 26:13–14 The sluggard says, “There is a lion in the road! There is a lion in the streets!” ¹⁴As a door turns on its hinges, so does a sluggard on his bed.

- Level 1 — Draw the ant working without anyone telling it what to do.
- Level 2 & 3 — In what ways are you like the ant, and in what ways are you not like the ant?

Tuesday: Proverbs 22:29 Do you see a man skillful in his work? He will stand before kings.

- Level 1 — Draw someone who is very skilled at his or her work.
- Level 2 — What do you want to be when you grow up? How could you begin to grow in the skills needed now?
- Level 3 — What skill should you deliberately be improving in your life right now?



Wednesday: Proverbs 13:11 Wealth gained hastily will dwindle, but whoever gathers little by little will increase it.

Proverbs 14:23 In all toil there is profit, but mere talk tends only to poverty.

- Level 1 — Draw two piles of money: one appearing suddenly and disappearing, and another slowly growing little by little.
- Level 2 — What happens to wealth gained hastily? Why?
- Level 3 — Are you more focused on working hard and gathering little by little, or are you more focused on catching the big break, getting in on the right investment, etc? Why?

Thursday: Proverbs 11:1 A false balance is an abomination to the Lord, but a just weight is his delight.

Proverbs 20:14 “Bad, bad,” says the buyer, but when he goes away, then he boasts.

- Level 1 — Draw a dishonest scale.
- Level 2 — Why does God hate a false balance? What dishonest thing is the buyer doing in Proverbs 20:14?
- Level 3 — While we may already know deceit is wrong in selling, how does Proverbs 20:14 expand our understanding of the need to reject all deceit?

Friday: John 4:34 My food is to do the will of him who sent me.

1 Corinthians 15:58 Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

- Level 1 — Draw a son faithfully doing the work his father gives him to do.
- Level 2 — What did Jesus say was his “food”? Why does Paul say that our labor in the Lord is not in vain?
- Level 3 — How can you work this week as someone serving the Lord?

Saturday: Proverbs 3:9–10 Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce; ¹⁰then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine.

- Level 1 — Draw a barn full of grain.
- Level 2 & 3 — What questions do you have about this passage?
