GRACE FAMILY WORSHIP GUIDE

March 15th 2026

This sheet contains sermon reflections, a monthly song, a memory passage, and weekly Bible readings.

Sermon Text, Questions & Activities: Daily questions and an activity for children based on the past week's sermon. Young children (Level 1) can draw, while older children (Level 2) and teens/adults (Level 3) discuss questions.

Monthly Song: A song to prepare for an upcoming worship service with weekly hand motions to engage young children. Focus on adding one stanza per week with your family starting with the first stanza on the first week the song appears.

Memory Verse: A scripture passage connected to the sermon series for all ages to memorize monthly. Try to memorize one verse or so per week.

Weekly Bible Reading: Five chapters from a 3-year plan to enjoy Bible intake habits and prepare for our church's Sunday School (The Gospel Project) content. Following this plan allows families or individuals to read the entire Bible in three years. If you have children in Sunday School, this will support conversations. If you do not have children in Sunday School, it is a chronological reading plan that allows for about one chapter per day.

This Weeks Bible Chapters: Proverbs 7; Psalm 10,11,12; Matthew 2

Grace Presbyterian Church March 13th - 21st

Sunday: Acts 4:23-24a When they were released, they went to their friends and reported what the chief priests and the elders had said to them. ²⁴And when they heard it, they lifted their voices together to God and said,

- Level 1: Draw a group of friends praying together in a room.
- Level 2&3: How might their experience have been different for better or worse if they had simply gone home and prayed alone?

Monday: Acts 4:24b “Sovereign Lord, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them

- Level 1: Draw mountains, ocean waves, stars, and animals God made.
- Level 2&3: What relevance does God being creator have on the opposition we experience for our faith?

Tuesday: Acts 4:25-28 who through the mouth of our father David, your servant, said by the Holy Spirit, “Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples plot in vain? ²⁶The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers were gathered together, against the Lord and against his Anointed’— ²⁷for truly in this city there were gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, ²⁸to do whatever your hand and your plan had predestined to take place.

- Level 1: Draw angry kings and crowds pointing and shouting.
- Level 2: Do these Christians see the opposition they are experiencing as random chaos or controlled by the hand of God?
- Level 3: What purposes might God have in allowing opposition against his own people, and making it harder to complete the mission he gave them?

Wednesday: Acts 4:29 And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness,

- Level 1 : Draw someone telling a friend about Jesus while looking a little nervous but still speaking.
- Level 2: Has there ever been a moment when you felt ashamed to be a Christian? What was happening?
- Level 3: Why is this the request they make of God?

Thursday: Acts 4:30 while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus.”

- Level 1: Draw people being helped or cared for by others.
- Level 2: How can we show kindness while also telling people about Jesus?
- Level 3: How are you tempted to retreat or revolt? What does that look like?

Friday: Acts 4:31 And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.

- Level 1: Draw a building shaking while people pray with big smiles.
- Level 2: Where does our boldness ultimately come from?
- Level 3: Do you tend to think of boldness to speak more of a personality trait or a Spirit given grace? Why?

Saturday: 1 Timothy 6:17-19 Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. ¹⁸Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. ¹⁹In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life.

- Level 1: Draw a person with a pile of gold in front of them, but looking up into heaven.
- Level 2&3: What questions do you have about this passage?
