Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

John 6:37-40 All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out. ³⁸For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me. ³⁹And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. ⁴⁰For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day."

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 20; Psalms 54,55,56,57**

Sunday: Acts 8:5-8 Philip went down to the city of Samaria and proclaimed to them the Christ. ⁶And the crowds with one accord paid attention to what was being said by Philip, when they heard him and saw the signs that he did. ⁷ For unclean spirits, crying out with a loud voice, came out of many who had them, and many who were paralyzed or lame were healed. ⁸ So there was much joy in that city.

- Level 1: Draw a map with a path from one mountain to another mountain.
- Level 2: The Jews and Samaritans had been divided for hundreds of years. What does Philip's trip to Samaria teach us about who God wants to save?
- Level 3: What kinds of people are we tempted to assume would never be interested in Jesus? How does Philip's ministry challenge those assumptions?

Monday: Acts 8:9-11 But there was a man named Simon, who had previously practiced magic in the city and amazed the people of Samaria, saying that he himself was somebody great. ¹⁰ They all paid attention to him, from the least to the greatest, saying, "This man is the power of God that is called Great." ¹¹ And they paid attention to him because for a long time he had amazed them with his magic.

- Level 1: Draw a crowd watching a man perform magic tricks.
- Level 2 & 3: What kinds of power do people admire today? Why are people often drawn to wealth, fame, beauty, influence, or success?

Tuesday: Acts 8:12-13 But when they believed Philip as he preached good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women. ¹³ Even Simon himself believed, and after being baptized he continued with Philip. And seeing signs and great miracles performed, he was amazed.

- Level 1: Draw a magician being amazed at the miracles of Philip.
- Level 2: Earlier the people were amazed by Simon. Now Simon is amazed by Philip's message. What changed?
- Level 3: Why is it significant that the man who amazed everyone else became amazed by the gospel?

Wednesday: Acts 8:14-17 Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent to them Peter and John, ¹⁵ who came down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit, ¹⁶ for he had not yet fallen on any of them, but they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ¹⁷ Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit.

- Level 1: Draw a group of Samaritans with Peter and John laying their hands on them and praying.
- Level 2: Why do you think God wanted Peter and John to witness the Samaritans receiving the Holy Spirit?
- Level 3: What were the circumstantial reason that caused the Holy Spirit not to be given even though they had believed and been baptized?

Thursday: Acts 8:18-24 Now when Simon saw that the Spirit was given through the laying on of the apostles' hands, he offered them money, ¹⁹ saying, "Give me this power also, so that anyone on whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit." ²⁰ But Peter said to him, "May your silver perish with you, because you thought you could obtain the gift of God with money! ²¹ You have neither part nor lot in this matter, for your heart is not right before God. ²² Repent, therefore, of this wickedness of yours, and pray to the Lord that, if possible, the intent of your heart may be forgiven you. ²³ For I see that you are in the gall of bitterness and in the bond of iniquity." ²⁴ And Simon answered, "Pray for me to the Lord, that nothing of what you have said may come upon me."

- Level 1: Draw Simon trying to give money to Peter and John and them saying "No!"
- Level 2: Why was Peter so upset with Simon?
- Level 3: How can people today be tempted to try to gain status, influence, or recognition in the church instead of receiving it as a gift from God?

Friday: Acts 8:25 Now when they had testified and spoken the word of the Lord, they returned to Jerusalem, preaching the gospel to many villages of the Samaritans.

- Level 1: Draw a map with a trail from Samaria to Jerusalem with Samaritan villages along the way.
- Level 2: Why do you think the apostles continued preaching in Samaritan villages?
- Level 3: How does this event show that Jews and Samaritans now belong to one people under one King?

Saturday: Read 3 John 1-4

- Level 1: Draw a man praying for children.
- Level 2 & 3: What questions do you have about this passage?
