Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

John 6:37-40 All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out. ³⁸For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me. ³⁹And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. ⁴⁰For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day."

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 22; Psalms 61, 62, 63, Matthew 9**

Sunday: Acts 8: 26-29 Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place. ²⁷ And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸ and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹ And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot."

- Level 1: Draw a long desert road with a traveler going one way and a chariot going the other.
- Level 2: Philip left a successful ministry in Samaria because God told him to go somewhere unexpected. Why can it be hard to obey God when we don't understand why He is leading us somewhere?
- Level 3: Looking back on your own life, where can you now see God's providence guiding your steps before you understood what He was doing? How might that encourage you to obey Him in the present?

Monday: Acts 8:30-31 So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹ And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.

- Level 1: Draw two people sitting together reading a large scroll.
- Level 2: Why was it a good thing that the eunuch admitted he needed help understanding the Bible? Why can that sometimes be hard for us to do?
- Level 3 : Do you come to Scripture to know God, or merely to confirm what you already think God should be like? How can you tell the difference in your own heart?

Tuesday: Acts 8:32-35 Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth.

³³ In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴ And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵ Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus.

- Level 1: Draw a scroll with an arrow pointing toward a cross.
- Level 2: Why wasn't it enough for the eunuch simply to own the Scriptures? What did Philip help him understand?
- Level 3: How would you explain to someone why knowing Jesus is different from merely knowing about God?

Wednesday: Acts 8: 36-38 And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" ³⁸ And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him.

- Level 1: Draw two hands holding each other or high-fiving to show a strong friendship.
- Level 2: Being faithful means doing what you promise. What is a promise you can keep today?
- Level 3: In verse 3, others testified to Gaius's faithfulness. If your community were to evaluate your spiritual walk, what specific evidence of faithfulness would they observe?

Thursday: Acts 8:39 And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing.

- Level 1: Draw a smiling traveler continuing down the road.
- Level 2: Why was the eunuch so joyful even though many things in his life probably stayed the same?
- Level 3: The Eunuch's life was basically the same except for knowing Christ, and yet he rejoices. What circumstances in your life tempt you to believe that joy depends on changing situations? How does the gospel offer a deeper and more lasting source of joy?

Friday: Acts 8:40 But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

- Level 1: Draw a road leading to many different towns.
- Level 2: Who do you think God used to help you learn about Jesus? Who might God want you to help someday?
- Level 3: Who in your life might God already be preparing, like he prepared the Eunuch?

Saturday: Revelation 21:9-27

- Level 1: Draw a mountain and a city coming down out of heaven.
- Level 2 & 3: What questions do you have about this passage?
