Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

**1 John 2:1-5a My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. <sup>2</sup> He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. <sup>3</sup> And by this we know that we have come to know him, if we keep his commandments. <sup>4</sup>Whoever says "I know him" but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him, <sup>5</sup> but whoever keeps his word, in him truly the love of God is perfected.**

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 17; Psalms 42, 43, 44; John 4**

# Grace Presbyterian Church May 24th - 30th

**Sunday:** Acts 6:1 Now in these days when the disciples were increasing in number, a complaint by the Hellenists arose against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution.

- Level 1: Draw a very large church family sharing food together, but with one sad widow standing off to the side who has accidentally been missed.
- Level 2: When a group gets bigger, why can it become easier for people to accidentally feel left out?
- Level 3: Have you ever assumed that being overlooked meant someone did not care about you, when the real issue may have been complexity, communication, or organizational strain?

**Monday:** Acts 6:2 And the twelve summoned the full number of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should give up preaching the word of God to serve tables

- Level 1: Draw the apostles teaching a large crowd while food tables are nearby needing helpers.
- Level 2: Why was it important for the apostles to keep teaching people about Jesus instead of trying to do every job themselves?
- Level 3: Were the apostles above serving tables? Explain.

**Tuesday:** Acts 6:3 Therefore, brothers, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we will appoint to this duty.

- Level 1: Draw seven wise and kind men helping care for widows and serving food with smiles.
- Level 2: What kinds of qualities might indicate that someone is full of the Spirit and wisdom?
- Level 3: What are you doing to grow and test your gifts so you can be effective in ministry?



**Wednesday:** Acts 6:4 But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

- Level 1: Draw the apostles praying together with open scrolls or Bibles while people nearby listen carefully.
- Level 2: Why do you think praying and teaching God's Word were so important for the apostles?
- Level 3: What would it look like for our church to intentionally protect and prioritize word and prayer ministry?

**Thursday:** Acts 6:5-6 And what they said pleased the whole gathering, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch. "These they set before the apostles, and they prayed and laid their hands on them

- Level 1: Draw the church leaders praying and laying hands on the seven men while the church watches happily.
- Level 2: How can kids serve and help in the church even if they are not pastors or leaders yet?
- Level 3: Do you primarily think of yourself as a consumer of ministry or as a minister who helps strengthen and support the mission of the church?

**Friday:** Acts 6:7 And the word of God continued to increase, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests became obedient to the faith.

- Level 1: Draw people teaching, praying, and serving food to many people.
- Level 2: How did everyone working together help more people hear about Jesus?
- Level 3: How could you do your part to minister to others in and through our church?

**Saturday:** Acts 6:8-7:60

- Level 1: Draw Stephen kneeling on the ground and angry men with stones standing around him.
- Level 2 & 3: What questions do you have about this passage?
