Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

**Proverbs 3:5-8 Trust in the Lord with all your heart,
and do not lean on your own understanding.**

⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him,

and he will make straight your paths.

⁷ Be not wise in your own eyes;

fear the Lord, and turn away from evil.

⁸ It will be healing to your flesh

and refreshment to your bones.

Weekly Bible Reading: Follow a 3-year chronological plan (5 chapters/week) to build reading habits and align with Sunday School (The Gospel Project) topics.

This Week: **Proverbs 26; Matthew 11, 14; Mark 6; Luke 7**

Grace Presbyterian Church July 26th - August 1st

Sunday: Proverbs 9:7-9 Whoever corrects a scoffer gets himself abuse, and he who reproves a wicked man incurs injury.⁸ Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you; reprove a wise man, and he will love you.⁹ Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning.

- Level 1 — Draw two people being corrected: one responding angrily and one listening carefully.
- Level 2 — How does the scoffer respond to correction? How does the wise person respond?
- Level 3 — What do your responses to advice and correction reveal about whether you are becoming wise?

Monday: Proverbs 9:10-12 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.¹¹ For by me your days will be multiplied, and years will be added to your life.¹² If you are wise, you are wise for yourself; if you scoff, you alone will bear it.

- Level 1 — Draw a path beginning with a person looking up toward heaven and ending in wisdom
- Level 2 — Where does wisdom begin? Who benefits when a person becomes wise?
- Level 3 — How does knowing that God is holy and all-knowing help you admit that you need wisdom?

Tuesday: Proverbs 12:15 The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice. Proverbs 15:22 Without counsel plans fail, but with many advisers they succeed.

- Level 1 — Draw one person making a decision alone and another person surrounded by wise advisers.
- Level 2 — What does the fool think about his own way? What benefit comes from having many advisers?
- Level 3 — Is there a decision or idea about which you need to ask someone else for advice?



Wednesday: Proverbs 12:1 Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge, but he who hates reproof is stupid. Proverbs 15:31 The ear that listens to life-giving reproof will dwell among the wise.

- Level 1 — Draw a person welcoming correction with an open ear and another person covering his ears.
- Level 2 — What does a person's response to correction reveal about whether he loves knowledge?
- Level 3 — What usually happens inside you when someone corrects you? What would a wiser response look like?

Thursday: Proverbs 4:7-9 The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom, and whatever you get, get insight.⁸ Prize her highly, and she will exalt you; she will honor you if you embrace her.⁹ She will place on your head a graceful garland; she will bestow on you a beautiful crown.

- Level 1 — Draw someone receiving a beautiful crown after going to get wisdom.
- Level 2 — What does it look like to "Get Wisdom"?
- Level 3 — What is one practical way you could make "Get wisdom" an aim of your life?

Friday: Proverbs 2:1-5 My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my commandments with you,² making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding;³ yes, if you call out for insight and raise your voice for understanding,⁴ if you seek it like silver and search for it as for hidden treasures,⁵ then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God.

- Level 1 — Draw someone searching for buried silver or hidden treasure.
- Level 2 — List the different actions these verses tell us to take in pursuing wisdom.
- Level 3 — Which action do you most need to practice: listening carefully, asking questions, calling out for help, or searching diligently?

Saturday: Read Matthew 9:35-38

- Level 1 — Draw a picture that comes to your mind when you hear this passage.
- Level 2 & 3 — What questions do you have about this passage?
