GRACE FAMILY WORSHIP GUIDE

February 22nd 2026

This sheet contains sermon reflections, a monthly song, a memory passage, and weekly Bible readings.

Sermon Text, Questions & Activities: Daily questions and an activity for children based on the past week's sermon. Young children (Level 1) can draw, while older children (Level 2) and teens/adults (Level 3) discuss questions.

Monthly Song: A song to prepare for an upcoming worship service with weekly hand motions to engage young children. Focus on adding one stanza per week with your family starting with the first stanza on the first week the song appears.

Memory Verse: A scripture passage connected to the sermon series for all ages to memorize monthly. Try to memorize one verse or so per week.

Weekly Bible Reading: Five chapters from a 3-year plan to enjoy Bible intake habits and prepare for our church's Sunday School (The Gospel Project) content. Following this plan allows families or individuals to read the entire Bible in three years. If you have children in Sunday School, this will support conversations. If you do not have children in Sunday School, it is a chronological reading plan that allows for about one chapter per day.

This Weeks Bible Chapters: Psalm 1,2,3; John 1; Luke 1

Grace Presbyterian Church February 22nd - 28th

Sunday: Acts 13:1-3 Now there were in the church at Antioch prophets and teachers, Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a lifelong friend of Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. ²While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, “Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.” ³Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

- Level 1: Draw people worshipping God
- Level 2&3: Imagine being part of a starting a new church. What would you personally find exciting? Challenging?

Monday: Acts 13:4-5 So, being sent out by the Holy Spirit, they went down to Seleucia, and from there they sailed to Cyprus. ⁵When they arrived at Salamis, they proclaimed the word of God in the synagogues of the Jews. And they had John to assist them.

- Level 1: Draw a sailboat
- Level 2&3: Why do you think the author emphasizes that the Holy Spirit sent Paul and Barnabas out on this work? What does this teach us about God?

Tuesday: Acts 13:6-8 When they had gone through the whole island as far as Paphos, they came upon a certain magician, a Jewish false prophet named Bar-Jesus. ⁷He was with the proconsul, Sergius Paulus, a man of intelligence, who summoned Barnabas and Saul and sought to hear the word of God. ⁸But Elymas the magician (for that is the meaning of his name) opposed them, seeking to turn the proconsul away from the faith.

- Level 1: Draw an island
- Level 2&3: Has someone ever opposed you for sharing your faith? What was that experience like?



Wednesday: Acts 13:9-10: But Saul, who was also called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked intently at him ¹⁰and said, “You son of the devil, you enemy of all righteousness, full of all deceit and villainy, will you not stop making crooked the straight paths of the Lord?”

- Level 1 : Draw someone being sneaky
- Level 2: Have you ever stood up to someone who is doing something wrong? What was that like?
- Level 3: What fears or feelings get stirred up in your heart over the idea (or memory) of calling out wickedness in someone? Why is it so difficult for so many Christians to do?

Thursday: Acts 13:11 And now, behold, the hand of the Lord is upon you, and you will be blind and unable to see the sun for a time.” Immediately mist and darkness fell upon him, and he went about seeking people to lead him by the hand.

- Level 1: Draw a blind person
- Level 2: Imagine you were standing, watching this happen. What kind of thoughts and emotions would you be experiencing?
- Level 3: What does the power of God at work in this verse remind us about in our own mission?

Friday: Acts 13:12 Then the proconsul believed, when he saw what had occurred, for he was astonished at the teaching of the Lord.

- Level 1: Draw someone with a surprised face
- Level 2: How did God use Paul and the magician (Bar-Jesus) for Gospel purposes?
- Level 3: The proconsul was not just astonished at the judgment against Bar-Jesus but at the teaching of the Lord. What does this remind us as we go on mission?

Saturday: Read all of Acts 3:1-10

- Level 1: Draw a picture of a foot (or trace your foot)
- Level 2: Imagine growing up never being able to walk and then all of a sudden, being able to. How would your life and mentality change?
- Level 3: (Read through 3:36). What do you notice about Peter’s response to those who are astounded by the miracle? What is at the heart of his approach with them?
