Sermon Reflections & Activities: Daily questions and activities based on the past week's sermon. Level 1 children can draw, while Level 2 (older children) and Level 3 (teens/adults) discuss the text together.

Worship Song: Prepare for worship by learning one stanza per week, including hand motions for young children.

Memory Verse: A new scripture passage tied to the sermon series every four weeks. Aim to memorize roughly one verse each week.

# Grace Presbyterian Church July 5<sup>th</sup> - July 12<sup>th</sup>

**Sunday:** Revelation 21:9-14 Then came one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls full of the seven last plagues and spoke to me, saying, “Come, I will show you the Bride, the wife of the Lamb.” <sup>10</sup>And he carried me away in the Spirit to a great, high mountain, and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God, <sup>11</sup>having the glory of God, its radiance like a most rare jewel, like a jasper, clear as crystal. <sup>12</sup>It had a great, high wall, with twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels, and on the gates the names of the twelve tribes of the sons of Israel were inscribed— <sup>13</sup>on the east three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. <sup>14</sup>And the wall of the city had twelve foundations, and on them were the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

- Level 1: Draw a bride walking in a beautiful city.
- Level 2: Why are the names of the twelve tribes and the twelve apostles on the city?
- Level 3: How does knowing you will spend eternity with God's people affect the way you treat Christians now?

**Monday:** Revelation 21:15-17 And the one who spoke with me had a measuring rod of gold to measure the city and its gates and walls. <sup>16</sup>The city lies foursquare, its length the same as its width. And he measured the city with his rod, 12,000 stadia.<sup>[d]</sup> Its length and width and height are equal. <sup>17</sup>He also measured its wall, 144 cubits<sup>[e]</sup> by human measurement, which is also an angel's measurement.

- Level 1: Draw a giant cube-shaped city.
- Level 2: Why do you think God gave John the city's measurements?
- Level 3: ·What does it mean that every Christian will live forever in God's presence?

**Tuesday:** Revelation 21:18-21 The wall was built of jasper, while the city was pure gold, like clear glass. <sup>19</sup>The foundations of the wall of the city were adorned with every kind of jewel. The first was jasper, the second sapphire, the third agate, the fourth emerald, <sup>20</sup>the fifth onyx, the sixth carnelian, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth chrysoprase, the eleventh jacinth, the twelfth amethyst. <sup>21</sup>And the twelve gates were twelve pearls, each of the gates made of a single pearl, and the street of the city was pure gold, like transparent glass.

- Level 1: Draw your favorite jewel or a pearl gate.
- Level 2: What do the precious stones teach us about God?
- Level 3: What earthly beauty most reminds you to long for heaven?

**Wednesday:** Revelation 21:22-23 And I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. <sup>23</sup>And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb.

- Level 1: Draw a bright city with no sun.
- Level 2: Why is there no temple in the New Jerusalem?
- Level 3: If you could have every blessing except Christ, would heaven still be heaven? Why?

**Thursday:** Revelation 21:24-27 By its light will the nations walk, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it, <sup>25</sup>and its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. <sup>26</sup>They will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. <sup>27</sup>But nothing unclean will ever enter it, nor anyone who does what is detestable or false, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

- Level 1: Draw people from many nations entering the city.
- Level 2: Who may enter the New Jerusalem?
- Level 3: How should this passage motivate us to pray for and share Christ with others?

**Friday:** Reread Revelation 21:9-27

- Level 1: Draw a bright city with no sun.
- Level 2: Why is there no temple in the New Jerusalem?
- Level 3: If you could have every blessing except Christ, would heaven still be heaven? Why?

**Saturday:** Proverbs 1:1-7

- Level 1: Draw a father teaching his son.
- Level 2 & 3: What questions do you have about this passage?
